Grading Policy

Tests: Tests will be given at the end of each unit.

Other Work: Throughout the marking periods, you may be given a graded assignment which can include a project, a review packet, or a take-home quiz or test. These items will be given point values based on the amount of work required.

Your letter grade for the quarter is based on the following:
