## AQUAPONICS

In 2017, each school building purchased stations that house complete aquaponics systems, thanks to the Lion Foundation. The mobile stations feature a fish tank on the bottom of a cart which provides fertilizer and water to grow plants on the table above. Some plants students have grown and harvested include lettuce, kale, and bok choi. This is a fantastic learning opportunity for students and provides a practical foundation in the areas of agriculture, aquaculture, and hydroponics.



## PBIS PROGRAM



The 17-18 school year marked the first year that the Positive Behavior Interventions and Support (PBIS) program was implemented at Hoover, Eisenhower, and the High School. The Middle School began its fifth year. PBIS is a proactive approach to discipline that promotes appropriate student behavior and increased learning. Teachers and staff encourage a positive atmosphere where students are recognized for demonstrating Lion PRIDE (Positive attitude, Respect, Integrity, Diversity, and Excellence).

## MAKER SPACES

Maker Spaces have been created throughout the district to establish a 4 C's community of collaboration, communication, critical thinking, and creating. These Maker Spaces allow students to discover, invent, and understand through a hands-on platform. Hoover and Eisenhower use mobile carts that can be moved to all classrooms and an area to showcase student creations. The carts include items like Ozobots, Snap Circuits, Keva structures, and more. The MS/HS library hosts Maker Mondays where students have the opportunity to build structures using Legos, create cardboard arcade games, and use Raspberry Pi to learn computer programming. The goal of these programs is to engage students and teach them practical skills that are important in today's technological age.


