

CAOLA LEARNING MODEL EXPECTATIONS



- **GENERAL INFORMATION**

- Students enrolled in the Capital Area Online Learning Association (CAOLA) program remain students of the Camp Hill School District.
- Students who meet all graduation requirements will be issued a regular diploma from the Camp Hill School District.
- Students must abide by the CAOLA program and plagiarism guidelines.
- Students will be provided and expected to use their CHSD-issued laptop to complete the online course work.

- **ONLINE LEARNING GUIDELINES**

- It is essential for students to be supported while in the full-time cyber program. Parents/guardians and school personnel (CAOLA Advisor, Principal, and School Counselor) will monitor progress in courses, and collaborate, in order to encourage student success.
- Students must exhibit effective time management and organizational skills, initiative, and motivation to learn.
- Students who are not making progress in their enrolled courses may be withdrawn from the CAOLA program.

- **PROGRESS MONITORING**

- At the start of each course, the CAOLA Advisor will use a formula to determine the number of daily assignments which must be completed in order to stay on track with the course time frame. Students' progress will be monitored throughout the school year on a regular basis.

- **GRADING**

- The course grade will appear on the report card when the course is completed (ie: marking period courses will appear at the end of the specific marking period; semester 1 courses at the end of marking period 2 and semester 2 courses at the end of marking period 4; year-long courses at the end of marking period 4).
- Students who do not finish all lessons within a course by the specified deadline will earn a grade of zero for the course and will not receive credit for the course.
- For seniors, all coursework and exams must be completed 5 school days prior to the last day of classes for seniors to ensure that course grades can be finalized for graduation.
- Failing a virtual course will affect GPA and, in some circumstances, graduation.
- All courses, grades, and GPA will appear on the student's transcript.

- **RELATED INFORMATION**

- Students will be required to take any state-mandated assessments.
- Students may participate in all Camp Hill School District sponsored extracurricular activities, programs, events, and athletics. Student athletes are under the same athletic eligibility guidelines as blended or remote students.
