Dear Community Members,

It seems that everywhere I look these days, thought leaders are not only singing the praises of empathy, they are recognizing that it is an essential job skill in the 21st century workplace. Countless articles, media reports, academic journals and social media conversations have placed a very bright spotlight on the seismic shift in importance regarding the "hardest soft skill you'll have to learn". So how is empathy defined? In my opinion, Brene Brown, research professor and author, delivers the best definition I've read: Empathy is connecting to the emotions that underpin an experience. In the book Dare to Lead, Brown references nursing scholar Theresa Wiseman's four critical attributes of empathy:

- To be able to see the world as others see it, or perspective taking
- To be nonjudgmental
- To understand another person's feelings
- To communicate your understanding of that person's feelings

Brown explains that empathy is a skill that strengthens with practice and encourages people to both give and receive it often. In our schools, empathy is at the core of a safe, caring and inclusive learning environment. According to Jones, Weissbourd, Bouffard, Kahn & Ross, researchers at the Harvard Graduate School of Education, students with high levels of empathy display more classroom engagement, higher academic achievement and better communication skills.

As we continue to reflect upon and move forward with our vision of Educational Excellence, Community Strength, Student Success and our commitment to providing **all** students with foundational skills, knowledge and opportunities for lifelong success, the essential questions for us are:


- How do we as educators, community members, and trusted adults model empathy for our children?

GREAT SEASON OF FALL SPORTS ENDS WITH 3 DISTRICT TITLES

Congratulations to the Girls Cross Country team and the Girls and Boys Soccer teams for winning District titles during the fall 2018 season! On October 27th, the **Girls Cross Country team** became the District 3 Class A Champions, winning by 25 points. Co-captains Laura Sakol and Kaitlyn Vorkaphich led the team and received medals for their 2nd place (Laura) and 9th place (Kaitlyn) finishes. The team moved on to compete at the State Championships where they finished in 5th place, the highest finish for a Camp Hill Girls Cross Country team since 1977.

The *Girls and Boys Soccer teams* both won District 3 Class A Championships on October 31st. This is the first district title for a girls soccer team in Camp Hill's history and the third district title in a row for the boys team. Members from both teams were named as Mid Penn Capital All-Stars including Ava Brackett, Hailey Dobb, Julia Raich, Sheridan Reid, Ben Brodie, Amias Colestock, Dylan Mayanja, Parker Rice and Kevin Young. Congratulations to the teams, coaches and all of our student athletes!

MISS PENNSYLVANIA VISITS CAMP HILL SCHOOLS

Miss Pennsylvania, Kayla Repasky, visited students in November to talk about bullying and social media. 



KINDERGARTEN REGISTRATION FOR 2019-2020
