

MINI-THON RAISES \$63,764 TO CONQUER CHILDHOOD CANCER

The annual Mini-THON event organized by Camp Hill High School students looked very different this year but the mission remained the same. Instead of the usual 12-hour overnight event, students participated in a 4-hour virtual Mini-THON on February 27th to raise awareness and funds to conquer childhood cancer. As with everything else, the COVID-19 pandemic necessitated a reinvention of the fundraising and event planning process. Student leaders demonstrated their resourcefulness and creativity as they learned new skills and tools, reached beyond their comfort zone, and organized an outstanding virtual event.

A fundraising goal was not publicly announced as the Mini-THON leadership team was not sure what to expect. However, with only one in-person fundraiser and no in-person Mini-THON or Mini Mini-THONs, the community raised an incredible \$63,764.67, which makes a cumulative total of \$446,000 raised in the last 6 years! The money raised will be donated to Four Diamonds and will positively impact the children and families at Penn State Children's Hospital in Hershey.
