INCLEMENT WEATHER & FLEXIBLE INSTRUCTION DAYS

Should an occurrence of inclement weather occur during the 2023-2024 school year, the District will invoke a decision to operate remotely (at home instruction through Schoology) using a Flexible Instruction Day (FID) OR a Snow Day (school closed / no instruction). This decision will be made the evening prior or at the earliest notice possible. This decision will be broadcasted through Blackboard Messenger by the Superintendent's Office and through Schoology by each school's administration. The District will not exceed 5 FIDs and 1 Snow Day throughout the academic year. Should additional inclement weather closures be needed they will be added as a make-up day on June 5th 2024 and beyond.
